Deerfield Conservation Commission – Meeting Minutes

June 22, 2023

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm, virtually via Zoom Minutes of the 6/1/23 meeting were reviewed and accepted as written with a motion from Ben Bryne, seconded by Sean Libbey. Roll call vote approved, 3-0-2. (note: had a short redo – in the first go around, Ann Mary made first motion, Ben seconded... but then realized that Ann Mary missed the meeting so couldn't really make a motion to accept minutes – we tabled the first motion and redid it)

Old Business

- 1. Eaglebrook Track site visit: Erosion Control Compliance
 - · June 5, 2023 Sean Libbey and Peter Law attended a site visit to view erosion control they met up with the site foreman and a representative from ProTerra. There were a few items of concern, i.e. there weren't quite enough stakes in the wattles and some wattles needed to be repositioned. They also didn't have the full 50 feet of back-up wattles on site. They were open to making the changes and Peter Law will check again in the next few days.
- 2. RDA Bement Parking Lot Hearing Continuation: Pursuant to the Wetlands Protection Act MGL Chapter 131, Section 40, the Deerfield Conservation Commission will hold a public meeting on June 1, 2023 at 6:00 PM, to consider a Request for Determination of Applicability filed by The Bement School to see if work depicted on submitted plans for 0 Old Ferry Road, property identified in the Assessors' records as Map 40 Lot 16, is subject to the Wetlands Protection Act. Copies of the Request for Determination of Applicability documents are on file for public review at the Municipal Offices during office hours and on the town's website at www.deerfieldma.us in the calendar event.
 - · No one from Bement was in attendance they are reviewing the project Peter Law had asked asked Emily Wright (Wright Ostermier Landscape Architects WOLA) to come tonight if there were any updates.

- · Via email, Mark Stinson confirmed that there are a lot of BVW in the area we will need
- an NOI and more detail as we go forward this was suggested in last meeting
- · Bement indicated via email that they are reconsidering the project. We can discuss further at the next meeting when they are present and start conversation about NOI (includes wetlands delineation) the project is in the FEMA floodzone 2

- 3. NOI DA Tennis Pavilion Hearing Continuation: Pursuant to the Wetlands Protection Act MGL Chapter 131, Section 40, the Deerfield Conservation Commission will hold a public hearing on June 1, 2023 at 6:00 pm to consider a Notice of Intent filed by Andrew DeMado of Deerfield Academy for renovations to the existing Tennis Pavilion structure, including the installation of sectional overhead doors and concrete curbing, on property located at 27 Albany Road, identified in the Assessors records as Map 61, Lot 12. Copies of the Notice of Intent documents are on file for public review at the Municipal Offices during office hours and on the town's website at www.deerfieldma.us in the calendar event.
 - · Charles (Chuck) Croce and Andrew White (both Tighe & Bond) gave an overview of project currently open air all sides, it sits within the floodplain, but outside of any wetland buffer area, structure has the ability to lower canvas shades to close off the open areas to reduce wind, light, rain, other weather, would like to improve the performance to replace shades with steel coil doors metal doors roll down and up on all 4 sides. There would be fill at door jams and curb around structure.
 - DEP comments on outstanding order of conditions for 3 projects they worked to prepare a certificate of compliance and submitted it this week, one project was related to ice rink & field house and the building the Zamboni ramp another project was related to the construction of the health center & repaving road down to athletic fields. Peter Law asked will 3 months be enough time to get everything to the registry and get things closed out? Yes, they are motivated to close those out.
 - · Peter Law recommendations 1) cleaning up outstanding order of conditions in the next 3 months 2) erosion control processes would be outlined in the form we send to applicant

Motion: Sean Libbey made a Motion to accept the NOI close out the hearing for 27 Albany Road Map 61, lot 12 – with the exception of 2 conditions as discussed 1) close out 3 open order of conditions that are outstanding in next 90 days 2) provide additional town of Deerfield conditions relative to erosion control methods as discussed 2_{nd}: Ben Byrne **Roll call vote to approve:** 5:0:0

New Business

1. Delta Sand & Gravel Cutting Plan – this was not in the meeting packet – will have to have Amy Hahn send it out. Peter Law did share his screen to go over the document. Sean Libbey commented it looks routine, but need time to have a look at it.
